Living free from violence is a human right, yet millions of women and girls suffer disproportionately from violence both in peace and in war, at the hands of the state, at home and in the community. Across the globe, women are beaten, raped, mutilated, and killed with impunity. Gender-based violence comes from the failure of governments and societies to recognize the human rights of women. It is rooted in global culture of discrimination, which denies women equal rights with men and legitimizes the appropriation of women's bodies for individual gratification or political ends. Every day, all over the world, women face gender specific persecution including genital mutilation, sexual slavery, forced prostitution, and domestic violence. At least one out of three women worldwide has been beaten, forced into sex, or otherwise abused in her lifetime.

Violence against women encourages discrimination and reinforces it. When women are abused in detention, raped by armed forces or terrorized by violence at home, unequal power relations between men and women are both manifested and enforced. Discrimination accentuates violence against women in terms of race, ethnicity, sexual identity, social status, class, and age. Such multiple forms of discrimination further restrict women's choices, increase their vulnerability to violence, and make it even harder for women to obtain justice.

States have the obligation to prevent, protect against, and punish violence against women whether perpetrated by private or public actors. States must show their leadership and responsibility in protecting individuals from human rights abuses. Yet such violence is often ignored and rarely punished. Too often, no one is held accountable for these crimes. With your help, we can hold states and perpetrators responsible and end this cycle of violence against women.
