Since the beginning of 2023, Dakar's police have evicted around 3,000 street vendors from Petersen Market, reaching other regions in Senegal. The reason behind these evictions is the current urban development projects aiming at cleaning up the country and achieving the government's Zero Waste Program goals (Programme Zéro Déchet), launched in 2019. In an address to the Nation on December 31, 2019, the president called for "a national mobilization against insalubrity and anarchic occupation of the streets."

However, street vendors claim that if the authorities refuse to let them work in the streets, they should provide better vending sites. They accuse national and local authorities of lack of transparency and having failed to include street vendors so far in the decision-making process, even though **they** are significant actors in the social fabric.

The authorities have proposed financial compensation based on a census contested by street vendors because it seems to exclude most of them. In addition, the authorities are proposing to relocate them to recently built shopping centres, which are poorly accessible to street vendors' traditional customers given the geographic location.

The street vendors' organizations are committed to working together to federate and speak on behalf of all their members to avoid obstacles in future mobilizations seeking to defend their rights.

To find a way out of the crisis, street vendors have already identified private plots of land for sale in several locations around the city, where they could carry on with their work. Through the Platform of Informal Sector Actors, they have requested city authorities' support to purchase the land. However, so far, negotiations with the authorities have resulted in unfulfilled promises. Numerous case studies conducted have shown that forced evictions are counterproductive.
